Tributes to 'Hero' Paramedic

As a family we are absolutely devastated at the loss of our beloved Tony to Covid-19 after he spent his working life trying to save people. Everyone who knew him knows he had three major loves in his life: his family and friends; football – travelling to watch Nottingham Forest and England at home and abroad; and his role as a paramedic.

Tony grew up in Keyworth going to school at the Selby Lane Infant School before attending the Nottingham Road Junior School then onto the South Wolds Comprehensive School.

He attended the Boys Brigade in the village and spent numerous years involved with Keyworth United first as a

player and supporter before qualifying as a linesman and referee where he went onto officiate in hundreds of games.

Tony who was known as "Chad" or "Chadders" started his working career with the East Midland Ambulance Service where he worked for over 23 years in 1997 in Lincolnshire as an Ambulance Technician before he transferred back to Nottinghamshire where he then went onto qualify as a Paramedic in 2007. He worked as a Paramedic team leader at Beechdale Ambulance Station before moving in 2017 to Newark Ambulance Station where he worked as a Paramedic Clinical Operations Manager.

Tony was without doubt an NHS hero who dedicated his life to his career. As he rose up through the ranks nothing was too much trouble for Tony whose huge heart meant he went above and beyond for his patients, colleagues and friends. He cared deeply

for his colleagues who were also some of his best friends – his work family.

The whole family would like to give thanks to all the incredible staff at EMAS, QMC and Nottingham City hospital who cared for Tony and fought so hard to try to save him during his short time in hospital.

We will all remember Tony for the funloving, caring, brave man who was so loved by so many and we would like to say thank you to all the people who have offered their condolences to our family and Tony's friends.





Crossdale

Goodbye and thanks to our reading champion <u>CRISSDALE</u> Mrs Campion

Mrs Campion, who has worked at Crossdale for 26 years, has decided that the time is right to retire. Mrs Campion has worked with children throughout school, and has been our lead TA for Reading Interventions and Phonics for many years... we doubt that there is a child in the whole school that has not read with her at some time! Her passion and enthusiasm for wanting to help every child succeed has always stood out and she will take a vast amount of knowledge and experience with her into retirement. We will miss her greatly, but we wish her every happiness as she embarks on new adventures in her retirement.

Carrots, soup and triangular sandwiches....

Our Reception class have been learning about healthy eating and looking at the wonderful colours of different fruit and vegetables. We read the story of friendship and sharing, 'Too Many Carrots' by Katy Hudson, which led us into making our own carrot pictures, looking close up at different colour carrots, making a carrot and vegetable soup to share and talking about how carrots are grown. For a slightly less healthy treat we made our own jam sandwiches to eat after a tiring 'Welly Wednesday' expedition. To tie in with recent work on shapes, we challenged them to make each sandwich either triangular or square.

The science of tooth decay

Year 2 have been investigating the effects of different drinks on our teeth. In one experiment, they placed boiled eggs in different drinks and left them for a week to see the effects on the shell. We talked about the egg shell acting in the same way as the enamel on our teeth. We also placed 2p coins in similar drinks to find out what happened after a few days. The Cola type drink was the worst for staining the egg shell and the lemonade took away all of the coating on the coin. In both experiments we found that water was the best drink for keeping our teeth healthy. Once we had collected all of the results



we wrote a letter to the Tooth Fairy. We told her about our findings and the things we need to do to keep our teeth nice and healthy. These included eating and drinking healthily and brushing our teeth twice a day!



Keyworth Lives

Paul Hackett CBE

The recently announced New Year Honours List includes a CBE for a former pupil of South Wolds School, Paul Hackett. Paul, who now lives in London, studied for his "A" levels at South Wolds in the 1980s. His is now the Chief Executive of a major Housing Association in London and he received his CBE for services to social housing. Paul is also an Honorary Professor at University College London and his parents live in Keyworth.



What is your fondest memory of growing-up in Keyworth?

My family moved to Keyworth in 1982 for my Dad's job. I had two really fun years in the 6th form at South Wolds before leaving for university in 1984. I enjoyed nights out in Nottingham with friends, including in non-term time. Nottingham was a really exciting place in the early 1980s with a lively night life.

To what extent do you think Keyworth has changed since the 1980s?

To be honest it doesn't seem to have changed that much to me, but I'm aware that there are new estates going up around the village. It's still a great place for families, with good schools and surrounded by countryside, but close to the facilities of Nottingham. Probably the biggest thing that has changed – and this isn't just Keyworth, is the unaffordability of housing. In the mid-1980s, a young couple with jobs could expect to be able to buy their first home in their early 20s. This is an elusive dream for far too many young people today.

The need for social housing seems to be as strong as ever, yet more households seem to be renting privately year on year – how do you manage to preserve and grow your housing stock?

My company Optivo has roots stretching back to 1945. Consequently we own housing with a market value well in excess of £10 billion. We're able to use our balance sheet strength to borrow from the capital markets at very low rates. We also sell around 700 homes a year (mainly on a shared ownership basis to households priced out of full ownership), and this helps fund our development programme. We also

have strategic funding deals with Homes England and the Greater London Authority worth £190m, plus we reinvest 100% of our profits into new and existing homes. This combination of funding means we'll invest £3.5 billion to build 15,000 new homes over the next 10 years.

2021 looks set to be a difficult year economically, what does this mean in terms of the challenges for the provision of affordable housing?

The outlook for the housing market in 2021 isn't great. However the Government have launched a new funding programme for affordable housing worth £11.5 billion, so that will mean affordable housing continues to be built by housing associations across the country. We're seeing signs of the major volume house builders reducing their development programmes. This makes social housing build programmes even more important. Social housing has traditionally been 'counter-cyclical' – helping to keep the construction industry going even in the bad times. This is important to help small and medium sized contractors and sub-contractors and the wider supply chain. It also helps to retain construction skills within the industry, which is even more important as we adapt to life outside the EU. So in short, 2021 is an important year for housing associations to step up to the plate and show creativity and tenacity.



Keyworth Cricket Club (1815-2021)



With all cricket suspended we hope all our members are trying to keep active to maintain a level of fitness so important to our personal mental health and wellbeing and especially for when we are allowed to begin

Indoor Training sessions. In the interim we reflect on one of the club's Legends, who started his working life in the Village Knitwear industry...

WILLIAM LACEY (born 1861) (Died 14 December

1932) Nicknames: Rake (in Keyworth); Wizard of Hurlingham (in Argentina).

Cricketer & Footballer for the Keyworth village teams from 1875 he played for Notts Colts against the County team at Trent Bridge on 11 April 1882 before becoming a part time professional for Grantham CC and in the Lancashire League and then moving on to become a professional Coach at Oundle School (1885) and then in Canada with Montreal Cricket Club (1886).


Appointed first ever Sports & Grounds Manager to the Hurlingham Sports Club being built in Buenos Aires, Argentina in 1887, he stayed in post until retirement in 1925 having been Architect, Builder, Organiser Supreme, Sports Manager, Instigator of Improvements, and Cricket, Polo & Golf Coach. He returned first to a rented house in West Bridgford whilst a new home named Hurlingham Lodge on Debdale Lane was being built but sadly wife Martha died before the move back to Keyworth where he resumed his involvement with Keyworth Cricket Club. Top scorer in the first ever Cricket Match played at Hurlingham v Buenos Aires on 6 January 1890, he played in the first Rugby Union match at Hurlingham and designed & built the first ever Golf Course in Argentina (9 holes) at Hurlingham. Hurlingham became the first ever Grass Horse Race Track in Argentina.and the leading Polo Fields with the Pacific Railway Board constructing a railway line from Buenos Aires city centre to the Hurlingham Club to facilitate spectators including for a football match between the Buenos Aires and Montevideo (Uruguay) clubs, plus the River Plate Athletics championships were staged on 15 August 1895.

William's son Lewis (Luis) rose to become one of the greatest Polo players in history and he represented England, Argentina and the USA in global tournaments and is recognized in the Polo Hall of Fame and such was his prominence in society life, his wedding at Rosario in August 1925 was attended by HRH Prince Edward the Prince of Wales with the reception at Hurlingham. William and his son Lewis established Lacey & Sons, a sporting goods shop at Sarmiento in the centre of Buenos Aires and they developed a Polo Shirt Logo remarkably similar to the one introduced by Ralph Lauren some 52 years later. Captain Lewis Lacey served with King Edward's Horse Cavalry during the Great War and his brother Captain William Lacey (junior) was a pilot in the fledgling RAF and decorated with the Military Cross but lost his life on 4 November 1918 just one week before the armistice.

We have many stories recollecting our Village Legends which we can share.



Currently the over 80s are being contacted by letter inviting them to come for an appointment. The letter has full details. By publication of this Keyworth News, all over 80s should have received a letter and by the end of the month the first inoculation.

At the moment the vaccine centres are: QMC, Kings Mill Hospital, City Hospital, Ashfield Health Village, Richard Herrod Centre in Carlton, Gamston Community Hall, and Cripps Health Centre.



A different Christmas with No Carols. Dragon isolating at the Gate!

Another New Year and now Lockdown. Riding Stables instructed to shut and over 500 RDA Groups told to close, which has meant that over 25,600 riders plus their Carers' are not able to benefit from RDA. The Lings Lane Dragon has gone back into isolation and like all our Riders and Volunteers he is missing RDA.

All is not lost. We have managed with the help of supportive Medical and Educational Professionals to enable the more able of our South Notts vulnerable Riders to ride elsewhere.

This RDA Group has received a Government dispensation to allow qualifying Riders following very strict RDA Covid Guidelines to continue to ride throughout Lockdown. This has enabled our Senior rider who rides at Lings Lane when allowed, to continue to Ride.. He has just come 3rd in a virtual Dressage Anywhere Competition .Independent Walk test.

Our teenager took his RDA Grade 3 Riding Test and passed with flying colours and one of our youngest riders will return to Lings Lane when they are allowed to re-open. He enjoys his Riding and has been allowed out of School to benefit from this activity.

Like everyone else, all our Volunteers and more challenged riders are frustrated that we cant offer any on site RDA sessions. We all miss the Social aspect of meeting up at the Stables. Until this is all over, we must Stay at Home.

To try and keep our participants engaged, RDA are running a Writing Competition ,Art Competitions and making fun learning packs available. 

I start with a wish to everyone for a better New Year than 2020 turned out to be. I imagine that at the start of 2020 we all had hopes for a good year, nice holidays, good family gatherings and that the organisations of which we were members would flourish and continue to provide us with friendship and happy occasions. All that was dashed in March and we are still enveloped with the repercussions of a very nasty virus which continues to cause suffering and loss to so many people.

In our u3a we have had to follow Government rules and guidelines although some of our groups have continued to operate using electronic methods and we hold our Monthly Meetings by Zoom. 
Formed in the dark days of World War Two, from the Air Defence Cadet Corps, the emphasis was to train young men in various aviation-related skills.







February brings Pancake Day and Valentines Day and its still cool, so something warm will be good and if you make your own marmalade Seville Oranges are still available - kath

Chicken & Chorizo Casserole

8 Chicken thighs

150g Chorizo peeled and sliced thickly

- 2 tabsp Oil
- 2 tabsp Plain Flour
- 2 Red Peppers, sliced
- 2 Leeks, sliced

Salt & Black Pepper, and a little stock



Simply coat the chicken with plain flour and gently brown with the

oil for 5-10 mins in a large frying pan, Remove and place in a casserole dish

with a tightly fitting lid, add the sliced Chorizo, peppers, leeks, salt and black pepper and bake in a medium oven for 45 mins. Check for seasoning and you may need to add a little stock to make a sauce. Then enjoy with baked potatoes with plenty of butter. Additionally you might like to include;-

Baked Leek & Peppers

This is so simple, just slice 3 large peppers (red, green & yellow) and 1 large Leek. Gently fry in a large frying pan with a lid and 2 tabsp Oil, salt and black pepper 10 mins. Check for seasoning, add a little stock to make a sauce and a generous sprinkling of chopped parlsey or dried herbs.

Barry's Salmon with Pea Guacamole

This simple and fuss-free fish dinner can be made either with salmon or your favourite white fish fillet. The pea guacamole uses just a few ingredients, and adds a huge amount of flavour. If you don't have sumac in your spice cupboard, use smoked or regular paprika instead. Happy cooking - Barry

Salmon with Pea Guacamole

750g new potatoes

- 2 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 100g feta cheese, crumbled
- 1 tablespoon sumac
- 4 salmon or white fish fillets, 120g each
- 2 lemons, grated zest only of 1. Other into quarters



FOR THE PEA GUACAMOLE

500g frozen peas

- 4 tablespoons crème fraiche
- 1 lime, juice and zest

Handful fresh mint leaves, plus a few extra

Preheat oven to 220°C/Gas 7. Bring a large pan of salted water to the boil, then cook the potatoes for 10-12 minutes. Drain well. Using the same water boil the peas for 2 minutes, then drain and whizz the peas in a mini blender or a stick blender along with the remaining guacamole ingredients. Add a little water if you need to loosen the mixture, then season well and put to one side. Put the cooked potatoes in a casserole or roasting tin. Crush gently with the back of a spoon, then drizzle over the olive oil, crumble over the feta and sprinkle with half of the sumac. Roast in the oven for 10 minutes, then remove from the oven and set the fish on top. Sprinkle with the remaining sumac and return the dish to the oven for 10-12 minutes, or until the fish is just cooked. Finish off by sprinkling with the lemon zest and extra mint leaves. Serve with the pea guacamole and lemon wedges. Serves 4 and can easily be halved for 2. My choice of wine for this dish is an Italian white such as Soave.
